# **CCA COMPETITION PHILOSOPHY**

# **Our Philosophy**

The first and most important responsibility of a school and/or college cheerleader is to **SUPPORT** the athletic teams and raise and maintain overall **SCHOOL SPIRIT** and **LOYALTY**. All competition is secondary to this main goal. In fact, competition participation for school teams is a reward for a job well done. Promotional activities or practice for competition at the expense of team support means that priorities are out of order.

Another important responsibility of any cheer team is to develop leadership and teach life lessons to each participant. Giving 100 % to all competition efforts, teaching life lessons and always putting **TEAM first** should be their highest priority.

# **Our Purpose**

- \* To offer a place for competition for those athletes who have selected cheerleading as their extra-curricular athletic activity just as all other sports are able to do at every game.
- \* To offer an outlet to recognize and reward excellence and hard work in the Christian cheerleading environment for school, home school, college, AllStar and Empower teams.
- \* To give Christian cheerleaders and Christian/faith-based teams a place to compete with their peers without intimidation because of dress, moves, music and other Biblical standards of behavior.
- \* To afford the opportunity to meet and fellowship with other teams from other cities, states and regions of the country. This allows for development of lasting friendships and provides increased networking opportunities, representing the Lord Jesus Christ.
  - + To honor and give pre-eminence to the Lord Jesus Christ in all activities and events.
- + To offer affordable competition with individual and team rewards and with nationals, the opportunity to be awarded college scholarships. (available at Nationals only)

# **Our Professionalism**

- All rules, costs, judging sheets and competition guidelines will be distributed to participants well in advance of all competition events.
- All music must meet the guidelines in accordance with the CCA music, moves and dress policy which may be found on the CCA website (www.cheercca.com). All music should have proper legal licensing. If there is a doubt music, it should be submitted one month in advance to information@cheercca.com in an mp3 or .wav format. Music not meeting the guidelines will result in not being able to be used at the competition event at all and no refund given. All routines, etc must also follow the other rules in the MMD policy.
- National Federation of High School Spirit safety rules for school, Empower and USA Safety rules for college teams will be in effect and strictly adhered to and enforced. AllStar teams must abide by USASF guidelines and safety rules. Besides the required team spotters, the competition administration will provide floor spotters in accordance with liability requirements and for additional safety.
- All events will be held on an official cheer competition foam bonded cheer floor. Nationals performance floor and tumbling strip warm up will be held on a regulation spring floor. Most floors will be 54' x 42'. At smaller events, floors may be slightly smaller. Stunt team, solos, duos and trios and dance teams will be held on the same floor as the team events. At most events, mat time rehearsal will be allowed as well as warm up on another floor or partial floor.
- Competition administration will provide experienced, qualified safety, deduction, building, jumps and tumbling, and overall judges as well as timekeepers and announcers. All judges must certify that they are not connected with any participating school/team in any way to avoid any semblance of impropriety.



1:30 music based on the CCA Music, Moves, Dress policy. 1:00 of non-music cheer

Time Penalties apply for max music and max routine.

All Music Max Time 2:30 Min time: 1:00

Cheers, Sidelines if desired but not on score sheet; Jumps, Tumbling, Pyramids, Stunts, Dance Music based on CCA Music, Moves and Dress policy.

# **VARIATIONS TO MAIN TEAM DIVISION CATEGORIES (sub-divisions)**

**Non-Tumbling** - Time limits follow guidelines of particular main division requirements.

This variation may be used in Non-Music, Cheer Music or All Music Routines.

**NO tumbling** at all is allowed with the exception of stunt load-ins or dismounts. When used, the tumbling must not be separated from the load-in/dismount. All skills allowed except tumbling.

**Non-Building** - Time limits follow guidelines of particular main division requirements.

This variation may be used in Non-Music, Cheer Music or All Music Routines.

All Skills allowed except stunting. No stunt or pyramid building. Routine is ground bound.

This division in **NOT eligible for Grand Champion**.

**Novice** - Time limits follow guidelines of particular main division requirements.

This variation may be used in Non-Music, Cheer Music or All Music Routines.

Skill rules for this division are as follows:

- No tumbling more advanced than walkovers (back & front).
- No stunting above shoulder level. (Elevator with back spot allowed)
- No twisting dismounts

This division is **NOT eligible for Grand Champion**.

**Coed** - one male constitutes coed. No teams are considered coed except varsity teams. Gender will not be separated in lower levels. Coed is grouped with all girl for Grand Champion. Coed will be judged on actual coed stunts in the coed/quantity category to allow percentage to be equal to all girl.

# **CCA DIVISION REQUIREMENTS - 2022-2023**

# SOLO/DUO/TRIO STUNT-A-THON STUNT (all levels incl SCH/EMP/ALLSTAR/COLLEGE)

SOLO/DUO/TRIO DIVISIONS (divisons may be combined depending on participation levels. Only offered at Classics and Nationals)

<u>School and Empower Divisions</u> are Elem, Intermediate, Junior High/Middle School, Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, Senior.

All Star Divisions are by division, but not level. Tiny, Mini, Youth, Junior, Senior

All Divisions - Guys and Girls compete in the same division. Not separated by gender.

**Solo** (this division offered only at Classics and Nationals) Time: 1:00 Christian testimony. 1:00 Cheer Routine. No minimum time Routines may be non-music, cheer/music or all music. all will compete in same division. Christian testimony should include scripture. **Tumbling** - May include all tumbling allowed in school, empower and all star categories, no matter the level.

<u>Non-Tumbling</u> - may include round-off, cartwheels, forward/backward rolls. These skills will not be scored as tumbling, only in overall. NFHS Spirit Safety rules apply for School and Empower. USASF rules apply for All Stars. All Stars do not have to follow their team divisions.

Duo and Trio (this division offered only at Classics and Nationals) Time is 1:30. 1:00 minimum; Routines may be non-music, cheer/music or all music. All in same division. Divisions all the same as listed for solo in School/Empower/All Stars. Goes by highest grade/age in grouping. NFHS Spirit Safety rules apply for School and Empower. USASF rules apply for All Stars. All Stars do not have to follow their team divisions. Tumbling - May include all tumbling allowed in school. empower and all star categories, no matter the level.

Non-Tumbling - may include round-off, cartwheels, forward/backward rolls. These skills will not be scored in tumbling. Only in overall.

Stunting by level will be allowed but not scored as stunting, Only in overall. Will count for routine difficulty.

Most important scoring aspect of these divisions are synchronization and all competitors doing the same skills.

Stunt-a-Thon (this division only offered at Classics and Nationals) Time is 1:00. No minimum. Non-music, part music or all music routines ok.

Teams from 4-5 members per team. One male constitutes coed. Coed only in Varsity/Senior Divisions. All other divisions no gender separation School - NFHS Spirit Safety Rules apply. Stunts allowed based on Division. Divisions are Elem, Intermediate, JHigh/Mid Sch, JR, Senior, Senior Coed Empower - NFHS Spirit Safety Rules Apply. Stunts allowed based on Divisions. Categories are Tiny and Mini- Primary Division Youth, Junior, Senior Coed - Primary, Plus or Premier Divisions. May change division from their regular team division if desired.

All Star - USASF safety rules by category and level. Stunts allowed based on Division. Divisions are Tiny and Mini - Levels 1 & 2; Youth, Junior, Senior and Senior Coed - Levels 1-5 No tumbling is scored in Stunt-a-thon unless as load in or dismount to a stunt.

Stunt (this division only offered at Classics and Nationals) This division is the same basic division as Stunt-a-Thon except that it is for college and open teams only. Time is 1:00 minute. No minimum. Partner Stunts team can have two competitors and one spotter. Spotter is only allowed to spot, NOT assist in building in any way. Open teams may have 4-5 members.

Coed rules are the same as above. USA/AACCA College Safety Rules Apply. Divisions are:

College Partner Stunt AG, College Partner Stunt Coed; College Group Stunt AG; College Group Stunt Coed,

Open Stunt AG; Open Stunt Coed. Divisions may be added as applicable.

# WHAT IS CCA EMPOWER?

# We saw the NEED

This division was created by CCA as a church/ministry outreach.

- a) Young girls (and sometime guys who see college cheer) love cheerleading just as other young athletes love basketball/volleyball/ soccer, etc. Churches and communities and rec leagues are constantly forming these outlets for the other sports, using them as an outreach for community involvement, and often as "after school" care/activities. Cheerleading is a natural athletic outlet for many. Programs have resulted in bringing whole families into the church because of this cheerleading connection. Empower is available for ages 5-18 and teams are divided by age and skill.
- b) Many other outlets for the growing sport of cheerleading involve situations and attitudes that parents are not willing to expose their child to because of the atmosphere, time involved and extensive financial obligation. Empower provides this opportunity with a wholesome atmosphere, a healthy environment, and a moderate financial expenditure. Empower fills this need.
- c) To meet the growing needs of cheerleaders and coachs in the recreation league, community, and church teams that are being organized all around the country. Often these teams have no where to go for guidance in organizing and operating a cheer program. They need training, resource information, s afety guidelines and ministry assistance in general. They truly want to be a part of a cheerleading ministry outside of the school or all star setting and create their own niche' in the industry.

Empower teams are the answer to this desire. They are neither school teams nor all star teams. Empower is exactly the ministry that is a perfect fit! It may be an exciting ministry for you! There is no membership fee to be a CCA Empower Cheer Team. CCA will provide assistance in program setup, training, and securing of uniforms.

# Who can be a part of Empower?

- a) A team formed under the auspices of a church for the purpose of providing the activity of cheerleading as a youth outreach.

  -May or may not cheer at church league type ball games.
  - -Participants do not have to attend the sponsoring church as the mission of this type program is to reach the unchurched using cheerleading for the purpose of evangelism and/or discipleship
- b) A recreation league formed within a community/area for the purpose of cheerleading. Almost always cheers for recreation league teams, but not required. A community center is often used for practices. Any type community cheer is welcome. This may be a normal type rec league or a neighborhood privately organized for the purpose of giving wholesome athletic opportunities for boys and girls. Often an "after school" league.

## Those who cannot participate in the Empower program but may participate in other CCA Divisions:

- An official school team that cheers at games for school teams.
- Empower teams who do not normally cheer for any type ball game cannot participate in GameTime division.
- A team that competes as allstar out of an all star gym that competes in many different competitions.
   Some coaches use Empower as a stepping stone to all star cheerleading. They are welcome to compete empower as they work toward building.

Standing Back Tucks can be performed in Premier Division only.

Empower PREMIER Stunts: All stunts allowed by NFHS Spirit Rules for high school

Tumbling: All Tumbling allowed by NFHS Spirit Rules for high school.

**NOTE:** Coed only in SR division. All others male and female compete in same division. For complete skill listing and rubric see to follow. In Empower there are no sub-divisions.

Dear Pastor, Student Pastor, Outreach Director:

Please give this just a few minutes to read about something that will not cost you anything and will provide a new teen and childrens's outreach opportunity for your inistry. We know your time is valuable so we want to make this information worthwhile to you.

I would like to introduce you to CCA, Christian Cheerleaders of America. We are a 35 year old Christian sports ministry based in North Carolina. Our mission statement is "to use the vehicle of cheerleading to evangelize and disciple young people for Jesus Christ." We are a non-profit, 501-C-3 corporation. We are ministry first and cheerleading second. We use cheerleading to draw kids into our ministry. We are Bible-based and Christ centered. Each year as we travel nationwide conducting camps and mission trips, we have hundreds come to trust Jesus as Lord and Savior and more than 1,000 every year make other decision such as rededications and total surrender to the Lord.

We started initially because of the cheerleading backgrounds of our pincipals combined with a great burden for young people. There were no organizations providing wholesome cheerleading. Every little girl loves cheerleading. the unforms, the gymnastics and fun! The value of a team sport to teach life lessons is well known, including the impact that coaches can have on their team members. We have combined all these things into a strong Christian ministry.

We began with camps for Christian schools only. That has expanded to colleges, allstar gyms, rec leagues, community leagues and more. In recent years, we started a new division/category call EMPOWER. This program is specifically designed for teams for ministry. These teams learn the skills of cheer but do not cheer at ball games. (unless you have organized church leagues for their age groups). They usually meet for "practice" once a week. During this time they will have a Bible lesson/devotion and usually scripture memorization drills. And of course they learn new cheer skills and plan cheer routines. The purpose of forming these teams is an outreach to reach more children for Jesus and into your ministry for discipleship. Parents will also come to a child's performances when they may not come to church. Consequently, this outreach is intended to reach families, not just the children involved in cheer.

As you are reading you may be thinking of several things in regard to this outreach. First, you may be thinking of the reputation in general of some cheerleaders. WE ARE NOT "THOSE" CHEERLEADERS. We have a music, moves and dress policy that clearly explains what music, what moves and what dress are allowed in this program. We do not allow scantilly clad kids with stage make-up inappropriate for children. Our cheers are positive and encouraging. Everything that we do is wholesome, family oriented and lifts up the Lord Jesus Christ. Our competitions that we provide for EMPOWER are not cut-throat and allow for fun, fellowship and recognition for a job well done. We can provide scores of Christian schools as references on the kind of program that we run. However, you will be the one running this outreach with your own people. We will only be there for assistance and the competition opportunities for these teams.

How do you start? First of all you need to have some leaders who are willing to work with this program. We actually have people in so many areas looking for this opportunity. If you put some information in your church bulletin or announce in a service, you will be surprised how people will come to you because they have been involved in cheerleading in some way in the past and also have a heart for the Lord. These will be your volunteers. You can share the information in this letter with them. Then give them our contact information and us thiers and we will begin to work with them. We will provide assistance in uniforms with discounts from a partnering company. We can provide video training as well as personal training. There is no charge for the video training (material/teaching methods/ministry ideas). There is an expense charge for travel, housing, food for a one time meeting with your volunteers and/or participants if you desire. If you wish this to be done by video or skype, that is free. There is no charge to be a part of EMPOWER. The only charge that would ever be charged by CCA is the competition team registration and participation fees or possibly a summer camp/retreat each year. These prices are the lowest in the industry. Yet it is still like sending your kids to Bible camp!

We ask that you pray about this information and see if it is something that you would like to include as a part of your church's outreach to children. Other programs have proven that it is a perfect way to get children involved and exposed to the gospel as well as get there parents and other family members involved also. We can give you these references for support and advice. Just this summer, one of our campers trusted Jesus (an 11 year old). She went home so excited and talked to her family. Both her parents got tears in their eyes and because of the 11 year old's encouragement started coming back to church (hadn't been since they were married) and have remained active to this day. Also in South Carolina another little girl from a secular gym was asked what she wanted for her birthday and she said, "just to go learn more about Jesus at CCA cheer camp." EVERY PRAISE IS TO OUR GOD!

# GUIDELINES FOR SPECTATORS, COACHES, PARENTS, PARTICIPANTS AND FANS (cont'd)

- -Good sportsmanship and Christian conduct should be displayed at all times. Teams and fans cheer for their own teams as well as other teams, even those competing against them. The atmosphere is not and never will be "cut throat" at CCA competition events. Unsportsmanslike competition at any time and in any form during the event may result in ejection from the venue at the discretion of the Competition Director. This includes bullying, jeering or booing any teams, slashing or sarcastice or vulgar gestures. Please do not use an apponent's mascot in any cheer routines. If you need a mascot in a routine use something very generic vs one you might be competing against.
- **REMEMBER**: No Flash photography at any time for the safety of the competitors and no photography in the line of sight of the professional photographer. Videography is allowed but again, not in the line of sight of other fans or a professional CCA videographer.
- NO spectators or participants shall approach the judges or the judging stand at any time for any reason. ONLY Coaches may approach a designated spot for scoring challenges. No spectators, fans or coaches shall approach judges at any other time or reason in venue.
- Scoring is based on TOTAL scoring %'s. Final scores are based on category judging compiled over a two day average. Pre-lims and Final Scores are added and averaged to obtain %'s, No elmination after the first round. Decision of the judges is final.
